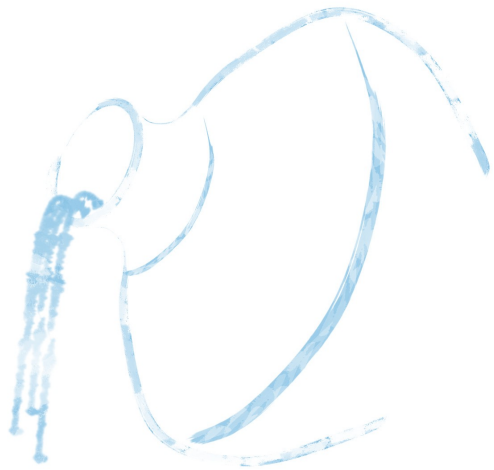


## Attitudes We Bring

## What do we believe?

We believe in God...no surprises there. But more to the point we believe in a God who loves us so much that there aren't any barriers that can stop that love: not time and space, not hard hearts or natural disasters, not broken hearts or broken families, not even death. In fact, in Jesus Christ God tore down those barriers once and for all.

We believe Jesus was God in the flesh - really human, totally human. When Jesus died on the cross, the power of death was shattered like a glass falling on a tile floor. When Jesus was resurrected, life at its fullest, deepest, and richest was made available to all.

We believe that that full, deep, rich life gets its power from the Holy Spirit. Life is still full of challenges, troubles, and disappointments but the Holy Spirit's activity in and through us gives us the courage to face them - along with a sense of profound joy at all the good things God and life bring our way.

We believe that the Bible is God's gift to us - a living retelling of the relationship of God and humanity that pulls no punches when it talks about our brokenness and holds nothing back when it talks about God's love. Sometimes the Bible is easy to understand and sometimes it's complicated, and that's why we read it together and talk it over with each other. It's more about life together than it is about a private sort of spirituality - but it does guide individuals toward peace and communities toward purpose.

We believe that Baptism is God's way of saying publicly, "I love this person and always will, and even though you might lose everything else - even yourself - you won't lose my love."

We believe that Holy Communion pours Jesus' life into ours, giving us hope and strength no matter what's going on.

And one more thing - we believe we're in this together.

Worship is the reason for the largest gatherings at Trinity. It includes a broad range of styles, music, and preaching - all with a commitment to excellence, and a passion for sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Trinity Lutheran Church also offers many festival and special services throughout the year: Christmas Eve, Christmas Day, Epiphany, Ash Wednesday, mid-week worship in Lent, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, Easter Vigil, Easter, Ascension Day, Pentecost, and Reformation Sunday.

In addition, there are special worship events like Thanksgiving Eve Worship, and a Children's Memorial Service (the 2nd Sunday in December).

## What do we care about?

## What do we do about what we care about?

Letting people know about God takes two things: being yourself and giving yourself away.

Telling people about God's love takes more than pamphlets...it takes relationship. You won't find us standing on street corners. Instead we'll be with our friends, being friends, and being ourselves.

Our schools (Harbour Pointe Christian Preschool is one of three we operate) are widely recognized for their quality care of children. We offer scholarships and financial support for families with financial need.

In addition to all of our "in-house" ministries, every year through "Living Water" we provide about \$100,000 for the development of wells and water systems around the world. We provide weekly community and support for our neighbors in need, and shelter in cold weather for our homeless neighbors. We also build houses in Tijuana, send health teams to Nicaragua, and provide education, housing, and health support in Tanzania.

There are literally dozens of small groups to connect with, each one "giving itself away" by sharing time and talents for the sake of others and our community.
