To Register

 - 3) By February 28th, you must turn in your completed Registration packet
 - 4) Pay the \$180 Brightwheel invoice by Feb 28th
- March 1, all remaining available spots will be opened to the public.

Research on Print Awareness

“The research is very clear. Children who begin kindergarten with strong print awareness skills have a real advantage in learning to read. Ideally by the time they finish preschool, children should be familiar with books and other printed matter and be able to recognize and write most of the alphabet. These skills are developed at home and in preschool settings. In preschool, teachers must consciously teach print awareness through intentional literacy experiences throughout the day. Print awareness consists of concepts about books, concepts about print and attitudes toward reading and writing.” [Quoted from: Comprehensive Literacy Resource for Preschool Teachers](#) by Miriam Trehearne



At preschool, we focus on print concepts throughout the year through a variety of experiences. We are making a Chicka, Chicka, Boom, Boom Tree on the hallway bulletin board soon and we need your help! This is one our favorite books we read in preschool. It’s full of rhyming, rhythmic language, and creatively introduces the letters of the alphabet.

We need you to help your child find the letters in their first name and mount each letter individually on some kind of paper.

Please bring the letters from your first name mounted (3 inches -10 inches tall) on any kind of paper you have; starting January 14th and we will use them to make our own Chicka, Chicka, Boom, Boom Tree.

Ideas of where to find large letters: grocery bags, fast food bags or boxes, food boxes, newspapers, magazines, cards, anywhere you find large letters printed.

GET CREATIVE and have your child participate. This is a great time to discuss the letters in their name. Ask them to spell their name and point out the letters.
