

We welcome internationally renowned organist **Simon Thomas Jacobs** to the Pasi organ to close out the 2018-19 season. In 2013, Mr. Jacobs was awarded both the First Prize and Audience Prize at the St Albans International Organ Competition. As the 22nd organist to receive this distinction since 1963, he has secured a place alongside some of the world's finest concert organists and has subsequently built an international reputation for his innovative programming, exacting technique, and engaging performances.

Mr. Jacobs studied Organ at the University of Cambridge, studying with David Sanger and Jacques van Oortmerssen and working closely with Timothy Brown and Clare College's chapel choir. After receiving an honors degree in music in 2009, Mr. Jacobs moved stateside, working as a church musician, first as Associate Director of Music at Christ Church Greenwich, CT from and then as Associate Organist and Choirmaster at Christ Church Cathedral, Indianapolis, IN. He also pursued further organ studies with James David Christie at Oberlin College, and was awarded the school's prestigious Artist's Diploma in May 2015.

Simon's debut CD, Parthenia Nova—the first recording of the first American-built pipe organ in London—has been praised as “an excellent recording that presents an interesting range of ancient and modern music on an exquisite new instrument..Jacobs' playing is masterful throughout.” (Kola Owalabi, The Diapason, October 2016) and has been featured on American Public Media's Pipedreams.
